Lot 295. The correct description is as follows: 1922 (12 June) Dail Eireann cheque to Charles Russell, Director of Civil Aviation for £82.14s.2d signed by General Richard Mulcahy, Chief of Staff of the Provisional Government Army. It is believed this was to cover the cost of transporting back to Ireland an aeroplane. During the Anglo-Irish Treaty talks of 1921, a Martinsyde Type A Mark II biplane was purchased by a group of supporters in England and put on 24-hour standby at Croydon Airport to allow Michael Collins to escape back to Ireland if the talks failed. The plane was not needed for this mission, and it became the first aircraft of the new National Army Air Service arriving (by sea) in June 1922. A unique document relating to the talks.

Lot 521. The illustration is by Edward Ardizoni and the signed by Simon Campbell who also wrote the inscription.

Lot 535. Estimate changed to €500 to €700 (£415 to £580 approx.)

Lot 557 is First Edition Third Impression, 1966.

Lot 611 lacks a leaf in the dedication.

Lot 697 on page 90 of the catalogue is incorrectly illustrated. It should be an image of the Aer Lingus poster attached. The image illustrated as lot 697 is actually **lot 698**.

Lot 765. The correct description is: Switzerland gold twenty francs 1902, 1908, 1927 (2), 1935 (2), 1947 (12), and a five francs (4), two francs (2), one franc (7), half frank (16), mainly very fine to extremely fine.

Lot 780. The correct description is: Olympic Museum London 2012 Collection of gold and silver ingots, and other framed items including gilded Irish Five Pounds note, Kennedy half dollars.

The Olympic Collection comprises a one ounce 9ct gold

ingot, and 4 one ounce silver ingots; there is also a gold plated replica of a Lady Lavery Five Pounds note and a collection of USA Kennedy half dollars. A very attractive and valuable collection of framed items. (3). Estimate: €1,000-€1,200 (£825-£990 approx.)

Lot 844 is a *complete* set. There was no £100 note in this series.

Lot 850 Please note that these banknotes are dated 1998.

Circa 1970. 22ct gold medal, 10. 5g, inscribed SEVILLA with couple on horseback in front of tower on reverse, coat of arms obverse. Issued by Acunaciones Espanoles S.A., in pochette of issue.

Estimate: €200-240 (£165-£200 approx.
