Lot 55: The officer on the left in the foreground has been identified as George Warburton who retired from the RIC in 1838 with the rank of Inspector General of Police in Ireland.

Lot 64: The family name of the recipients of these medals is McGaleagly.

Lot 104 Description should read: collection of eight election posters 1965-1994 including James Dillon (1965 General Election); Tom O'Higgins (1973 Presidential Election); Garret Fitzgerald (1982 General Election) two posters; Alan Dukes (1987 General Election) and John Bruton (1994 General Election), also two posters for Alexis Fitzgerald, Gay Lyons, Willie Naughton and Fergus O'Brien (1969).
